Mick Arellano is half Mexican-American and half Norwegian-American. He was stationed at Hickam Air Force Base in Honolulu from 1966 to the end of 1968. He graduated with distinction in Philosophy at the University of Washington, Seattle, in 1972, and for the next seven years called Hawaii his part-time home, wintering at Kihei Beach on Maui while pursuing advanced study spring-to-autumn at his alma mater. His last visit to Hawaii was a short stay with friends on Kauai in 1982.

Arellano is the author of several non-fiction publications, including *Teach Yourself to Swim Despite Your Fear of Water* (New York 1978), *Browsing The Best West Coast Used Book Stores* (Berkeley 1993), *The California Guide to East Coast Colleges* (Berkeley 2003), *The Quick Guide to California Colleges* (Berkeley 2004), and *A Traveler's History of Spain* (in preparation). For the past twenty-two years he has lived in the San Francisco Bay Area with his half Brazilian daughter.
